band. A good friend and colleague of many SHEA members, Jonathan will be greatly missed.

SHEA/CDC Course

The SHEA/CDC Training Course in Hospital Epidemiology will be held on May 12-15, 2000, in Jacksonville, Florida. The course covers basic infection control and epidemiological methods in healthcare settings, the epidemiology of healthcareassociated infections (including dialysis), surveillance, epidemic investigation (including three problem sessions), antimicrobial resistance, and an introduction to molecular typing. All of those involved in healthcare epidemiology and infection control are invited to attend.

Federal Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance

A Federal Action Plan to combat antimicrobial resistance (www.cdc.gov/ drugresistance/actionplan) was published in June 2000. The draft plan was co-chaired by the CDC; the FDA; the NIH; the AHRQ; the Departments of Agriculture, Defense, and Veterans Affairs: the HCFA; the EPA; and the Health Resources and Services Administration. The plan outlines recommendations for surveillance, prevention and control, research, and product development to improve antimicrobial use and for decreasing antimicrobial resistance.
