THE IX CONGRES D'HISTOIRE DE LA COURONNE D'ARAGON Was held at Naples, April 11–15, 1973, under the auspices of the Società Napoletana di Storia Patria. The subject was 'La Couronne d'Aragon et la Mediterranée: aspects et problèmes communs, d'Alphonse le Magnanime à Ferdinand le Catholique (1416–1516).' The introductory paper was given by Ernesto Pontieri on 'Les Aragonais de Naples et les Etats italiens de la seconde moitié du Quattrocento.' Other papers were delivered by Miquel Batllori, Ferdinando Bologna, Mario Del Treppo, Giuseppe Galasso, Jesús Lalinde, Federigo Melis, Ruggero Moscati, Martín de Riquer, Federico Udina.

THE MEDIEVAL INSTITUTE OF WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY held its eighth Conference on Medieval Studies at the Goldsworth Valley \$3 Complex of Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, April 29–May 2, 1973. Related events included the third Conference on Cistercian Studies; a multimedia program on the Dance-of-Death theme, presented by the Society for Old Music; a musical program by the Western Michigan Collegium Musicum, followed by a presentation of the Crucifixion Sequence of the Towneley Cycle by the Poculi Ludique Societas of the Centre for Medieval Studies of the University of Toronto; a discussion and training session in practical aspects of medieval combat, followed by a tournament, under the auspices of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. The two winning plays of the 1973 Conference Drama Project (plays on Medieval and Renaissance themes) were to be produced and the awards presented.

THE SIXTEENTH CENTURY STUDIES CONFERENCE will meet at St. Louis, Missouri, on October 26–27, 1973. Papers are invited for sessions on the following themes: demography, printing and publishing, historiography, art history, musicology, economic thought, diplomacy, literature, and political radicalism. THE ELVEHJEM ART CENTER of the University of Wisconsin, Madison, staged an exhibition entitled 'Italian Festival Designs,' March 15-

May 6, 1973, prepared by Arthur Blumenthal, Curator of the Center. In conjunction with the exhibition there were two performances of Monteverdi's Orfeo and Machiavelli's La Mandragola. Scheduled lectures include: Donald Oenslager, Jr., 'The Heritage of the Italian Renaissance Theater,' and Robert J. Rodini (U of Wisconsin, Madison), 'Three Moments in the Italian Renaissance Theater: Poliziano's Orfeo, Machiavelli's Mandragola, and Tasso's Aminta.'

RENAISSANCE FAIR: MINNESOTA ART LEAGUE. The third Annual Renaissance Fair under the sponsorship of the Minnesota Art League will be held September 8–9, 15–16, 22–33, 1973, in Minneapolis, Minnesota.
