



Morandi's Last Prophecy and the End of Renaissance Politics Brendan Dooley

One year before Galileo's, another trial was the talk of Rome. The city's most notorious astrologer—Orazio Morandi, abbot of the monastery of Santa Prassede—was brought before the governor's court. His most serious crime was to have predicted the death of Pope Urban VIII. The pope, furious at such effrontery, personally ordered the criminal inquiry that led to Morandi's arrest, trial, and death in prison, probably by assassination.

Based on new evidence, this book chronicles Morandi's fabulous rise and fall against the backdrop of enormous political and cultural turmoil that characterized Italy in the early seventeenth century.




