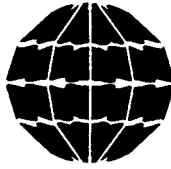

# International Political Science Association's XIVth World Congress

## General Information

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The International Political Science Association (IPSA) was founded in 1949 under the auspices of UNESCO. It is a nonprofit organization whose objectives are to promote the advancement of political science throughout the world by such means as the establishment of national associations; to organize world congresses and roundtables; to provide documentary and reference services; to facilitate the spread of political science information; and to promote internationally planned research. IPSA strives to advance research and facilitate contact among political scientists belonging to various regions of the world and different political systems.

IPSA currently undertakes a great variety of activities; it

- publishes *International Political Science Abstracts*;
- publishes the *International Political Science Review*;
- publishes *Advances in Political Science: An International Series*;
- publishes a newsletter, *Participation*;
- organizes a World Congress every three years;
- sponsors 21 Research Committees and 18 Study Groups;
- holds several research seminars and roundtables annually;
- collaborates in interdisciplinary work with other international associations;
- promotes the growth and improvement of the discipline of political science throughout the world.

Membership in the International Political Science Association falls into three categories: Collective Members (national or regional political science associations), Associate Members (universities, departments, research institutes, etc.) and Individual Members.

The Association's Council, composed primarily of delegates of collective members (who hold one, two or three seats), meets at the time of each world congress. It elects the President and other members of the Executive Committee.
