RULES RELATING TO MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 3. (a) Members shall be divided into three classes:
- (1) Resident Members; those who usually reside or have a place of business within the London Postal Area.
- (2) Non-resident Members; those who usually reside outside, and have not a place of business within, the above-stated Area
- (3) Honorary Members and Foreign Extraordinary Members admitted as hereinafter provided.
- (b) Members in the first two classes are hereinafter designated Ordinary Members.
- 4. Any person desirous of becoming an Ordinary Member must be nominated by one Member and seconded by another, of whom one must act on a personal knowledge that the candidate is likely to be a suitable and useful Member; and the nominating Member shall address the Secretary in writing and give the candidate's name, address, and occupation, or status, and shall state to which of the aforesaid classes the candidate desires to be admitted.
- 17. The annual subscriptions of Ordinary Members shall be as follows:—

19. An Ordinary Member may compound for all future annual subscriptions by paying in lieu thereof one sum calculated according to the Member's age and category as follows:—

Under 40 years of age: Eleven times the annual subscription as laid down in Rule 17.

Between 40 and 60 years of age: Nine times the annual subscription as laid down in Rule 17.

Over 60 years of age: Seven times the annual subscription as laid down in Rule 17.

- 23. The first payment of subscription is due on election, but if a Member be elected in November or December of any year, the first annual subscription paid by him shall cover the year beginning on the 1st January next after his election.
- 24. Annual subscriptions shall be due on the first day of January of each year.

Every member of the Society whose subscription is paid is entitled to receive the quarterly Journal post free.

PREFACE

I am reprinting in these volumes a number of studies and texts which have appeared during the last fifty years in various journals here and abroad. I have limited myself chiefly to texts which I had published for the first time, together with their translations, introductions and annotations, for whatever the value of essays and studies may be, that of texts remains the same. They are not affected by differences concerning origin, date and interpretation. On the contrary, they retain a permanent value, and form the basis for further investigation. Nor am I aware that any one of these texts has since been published elsewhere.

These studies and texts cover a somewhat wide field. They touch upon many subjects. A large number belong to the literature of the Apocrypha, others deal with the liturgy and Midrash; some belong to ancient fiction and mediaeval romance, and not a few are studies in folklore in the widest sense. A special section has been set aside for Samaritan texts, and notably Samaritan amulets. Biblical archaeology is the subject of some of the larger articles, and a few Rumanian texts with their translations have also been included. I have omitted however nearly all those Rumanian texts published by me without any translation. I have also been forced to omit others which have become inaccessible even to me. These articles written in many languages have all been reproduced in facsimile, reappearing here in the same form as they first appeared in the various journals. In spite of the incongruous appearance, the student, I think, will be grateful that I have retained them in their original form and with their pagination, references to them having been made by scholars; it will therefore be easy to trace them here. To the older pagination of each separate article,
