Father T. W. Burke, of St. Aelred's, York, writes about his book:

"This book was born from a pastoral necessity. When as a priest I am confronted with a couple coming to make arrangements about their marriage I want to get them to see beyond the legal aspects of marriage and the tedious form filling to the dignity of their vocation. I knew of no book in English which I could put into their hands and say, 'This is how God made marriage. This is how he wants your marriage to be'. Then I was introduced to the French Anneau d'Or series; in one issue I found a collection of texts from some forty continental theologians on this very theme. A translation by itself would perhaps be too difficult for the average reader, so this book came into being - a harmony and popular presentation of their thought".

Young people, engaged or thinking of getting married, need some help on many subjects. They need it in the context of an ideal, and a religious faith. This book is not concerned to point out pit-falls, but to give advice from the author's long experience of talking to engaged couples, and advising recently married people. The advice runs all the way through courting and budgeting to the physical relationship, for which Dr. Marshall provides detailed guidance.

Dr. Marshall, Reader in Neurology at London University, is a medical adviser to the Catholic Marriage Advisory Council.
