EDITOR'S NOTE

Upon publication of the 1990 *Proceedings*, the Society will have regularized a production schedule for the *Proceedings* of the Annual Meeting. Subsequent issues should be available by the end of the year in which the meeting takes place.

Producing these annual volumes has become more demanding. A basic reason is that the Annual Meetings themselves have expanded significantly. In 1980, the meeting had fifteen panels; in 1989, twenty-eight; the *Proceedings* grew from 361 to 654 pages, and the number of people participating as contributors or reviewers increased proportionately. Another reason is the thoroughness of the coverage. An assigned reporter produces a draft report of each panel using written papers if supplied by the panelists, a transcription of the tape if no paper is provided, and a transcription of the discussion section. These reports are then read by a substantive editor and a copyeditor and sent to the speakers for review. Once the issue is typeset and proofread, an index is prepared.

This is a time-consuming process, but the Society feels it is necessary in order to produce a true record of the meetings and to provide a useful and enduring reference tool. The Society also realizes, however, the importance of getting these issues published before the material is old news. Our intention is, from now on, to produce an issue that is both timely and enduring. We greatly appreciate the help of the many people whose participation is essential to producing these volumes.
