

## CORRIGENDUM

The Chemical Preservation, Colouring and Flavouring of Foodstuffs with  
Special Reference to Fruit and Vegetables

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The first paragraph should read as follows:

There are only two preservatives permitted in the U.K., U.S.A. and many other countries, namely sulphur dioxide and benzoic acid, although as a wartime measure the U.K. regulations were relaxed to some extent (e.g. to include the use of borax in bacon and margarine). Australia and New Zealand still permit the use of boric and salicylic acids.
