Opportunities for Visiting Fellows

The Research Program in International Security (RPIS) at Princeton University's Center of International Studies will award visiting pre- and post-doctoral fellowships for the academic year 1995-96.

RPIS was established to promote the study of the causes, character, consequences, and control of military rivalry and violent conflict, both within states and between them. The Program welcomes applications from scholars whose work addresses these issues, regardless of discipline or methodology. Visiting fellows will be in residence at Princeton during the 1995-96 academic year. Pre-doctoral fellows will receive a stipend of approximately \$16,500 and will be expected to complete work on their doctoral dissertations. Post-doctoral fellows (who must have their Ph.D. in hand by August 1995) will be expected to make substantial progress toward completion of a book-length manuscript and will receive a stipend of approximately \$33,000.

Applications should include the following:

1. A current curriculum vitae
2. A research proposal of no more than 3,000 words
3. Three letters of recommendation (to be sent directly to RPIS)

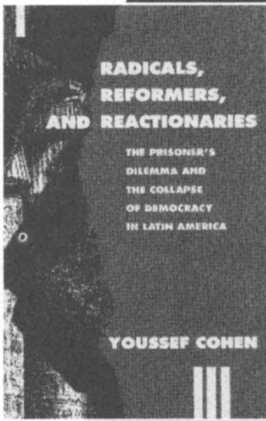

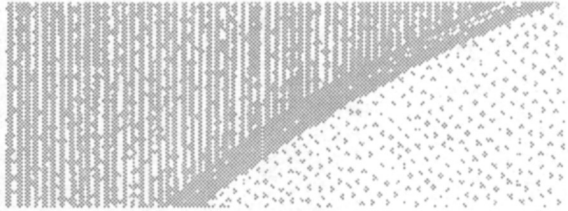
