#### 1995 Convention Sets Attendance Records

The 53rd annual meeting of the Midwest Political Science Association (MPSA), held April 6–8 in Chicago was the largest in the history of the association. 2,105 individuals participated in the meeting, which featured 280 panels and 22 poster presentations with more than 1,600 paper presenters, discussants, and chairs. The meeting was held for the 12th year at the Palmer House Hilton.

#### **Special Programs**

Two special programs were included in the 1995 meeting. A plenary session was held that featured a speech by the Deputy Prime Minister of Quebec, Bernard Landry, on "Quebec's Political Future." In honor of the 75th anniversary of women's suffrage, Jane Cox, of the Catt Center at Iowa State University, performed a dramatic reading of "The Yellow Rose of Suffrage, a tribute to Carrie Lane Chapman Catt, feminist leader, co-founder of the League of Women Voters, and advocate for women's suffrage. The tribute was co-sponsored with the Midwest Women's Caucus for Political Science.

#### **New Officers Elected**

#### Pi Sigma Alpha Best Paper Award

Christopher Wlezien was honored for having written the best paper delivered at SWPSA's 1994 annual meeting; the paper is entitled, "The Public as Thermostat: Budgetary Politics and the Dynamics of Preferences for Spending." #### 1995 Ted Robinson Memorial Award
