### *The Teotihuacán Map*

*The Teotihuacán Map* is the first of several volumes on a long-term project centering on the preparation of a detailed archaeological map of the ancient city of Teotihuacán in the Valley of Mexico. The text and captions of Part One of this volume were written by René Millon. Part Two, which includes 147 pairs of map sheets and 3 large fold-out maps, was jointly prepared by Millon, R. Bruce Drewitt, and George L. Cowgill. Volume One, Parts One and Two, will include the following: an introduction; a discussion of problems of method; explanations, comments, and interim conclusions; a concordance of the project's site numbers with previous designations for buildings and other sites in the city; fifty pages of photographs, including many aerial shots; 147 map sheets with acetate overlays; three large fold-out maps; bibliography and index.

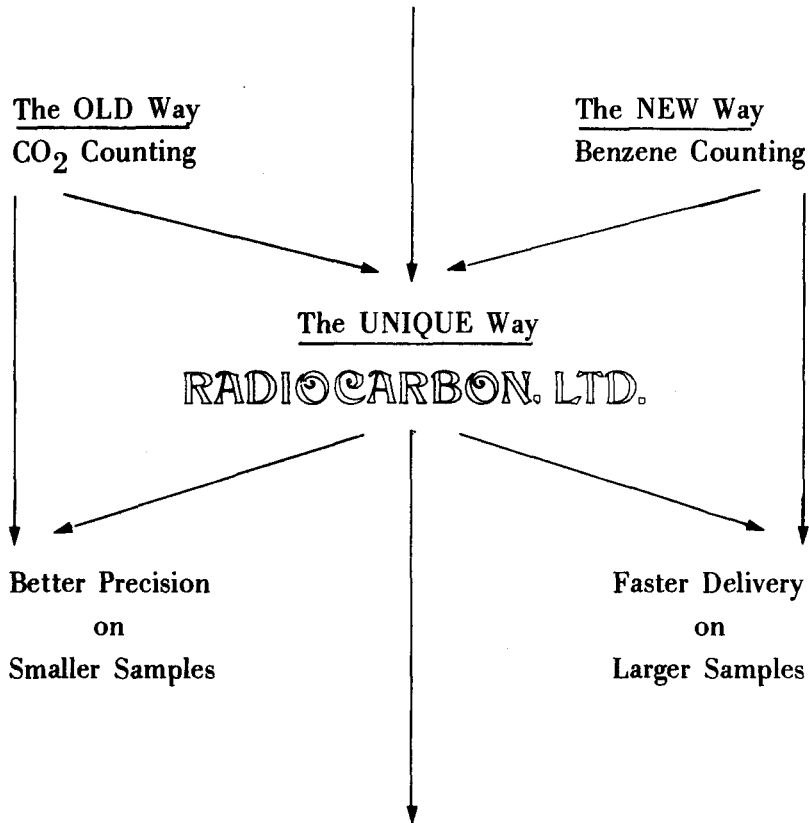
map, and descriptive and illustrative presentations of Teotihuacán ceramics and the chronological information derived from them. Volumes will be priced individually.

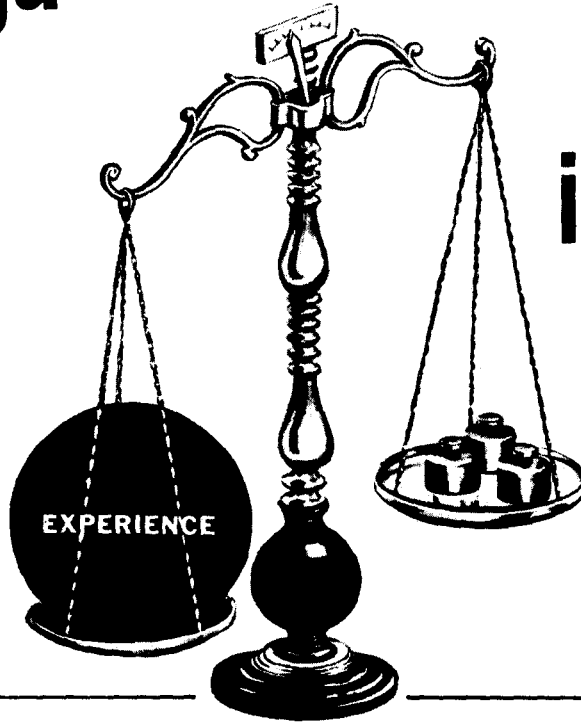
