Texts concerning these subjects, with translations and comments, will be considered; exclusively philological articles will not be accepted. Copyright is held by the British Institute for the Study of Iraq.

Contributors

Wherever possible, articles should be submitted on disc and accompanied by a hard copy together with details of the programme and font(s) used. Please leave any formatting to a minimum; your hard copy will be marked up by the editors to conform with house style. Illustrations should be submitted on CD in JPEG or TIFF format at a minimum of 300 dpi, or as clear prints of photographs or strong outline drawings in ink. Laser-quality print-outs of complicated computer-generated tables or graphics would be appreciated, submitted as pdf and Word.

Abbreviations follow those currently accepted in the journals *Orientalia* and *Archiv für Orientforschung*. Be sure to include the following as end-matter: (a) a full list of references or a bibliography, (b) an abstract of about 100 words suitable for translation into Arabic, and (c) your address and email for academic purposes.
