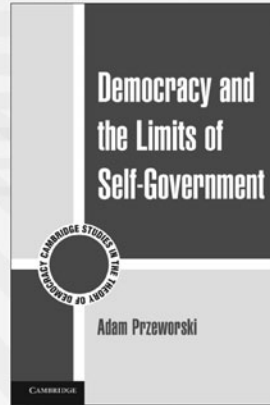

Hence, although the analysis identifies the limits of democracy, it also points to directions for feasible reforms.
