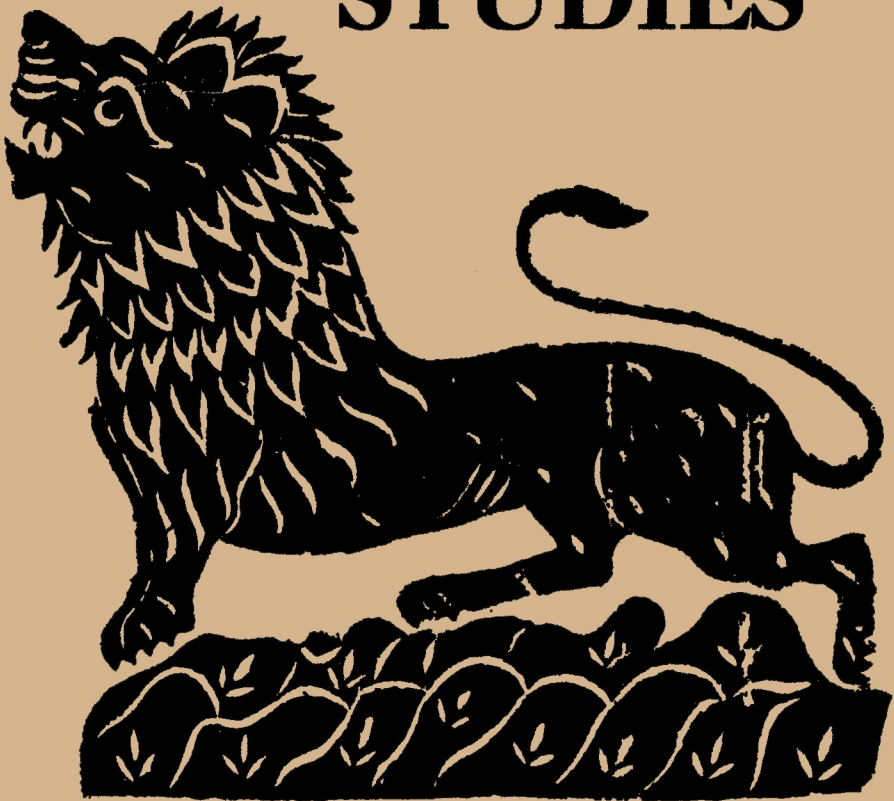

## CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

John T. Evans received his Ph.D. from Stanford in 1971 and has been teaching there since 1969. His forthcoming book is entitled *Politics and Officeholding in Seventeenth-Century Norwich*. He is currently working on the Crown's relations with municipal corporations after the Restoration.

Arthur B. Ferguson, Professor of History at Duke University, is the author of *The Indian Summer of English Chivalry* and *The Articulate Citizen and the English Renaissance*. He has written a number of articles dealing with the nature of historical thought in Renaissance England.

Elizabeth Read Foster is Professor of History at Bryn Mawr College. She has edited *Proceedings in Parliament in 1610*. In *The Painful Labour of Mr. Elsyng* she has studied the Clerk of the Parliaments from 1621 to 1635. Her articles on the history of Parliamentary procedure have appeared in the *Bulletin of the Institute of Historical Research*, *J.B.S.*, and elsewhere. Professor Foster is currently engaged in a study of House of Lords procedure under the Stuarts.

Barry McGill, Professor of History at Oberlin College, has written articles on Francis Schnadhorst and Asquith. His current research centers around the Liberal Party in the years from 1918 to 1935.

Peter Weiler is Assistant Professor of History at Boston College. He has published an article, "The New Liberalism of L. T. Hobhouse", and is presently researching the British trade union movement and foreign policy.
