

AFIR STOCKHOLM 2007

CALL FOR PAPERS

The Scientific Committee invites authors to submit papers for the 17th International AFIR Colloquium held in Stockholm, Sweden, 12-15 June 2007.

TOPICS

The topic of a paper can be any AFIR subject, i.e. relating to financial risk in the widest sense. In particular the committee welcomes papers on risks that are of importance in insurance, pension funds and banking, e.g. market risk, operational risk and actuarial risk and also risk management.

FORMALITIES

- Papers should be submitted in their final form by 31 January 2007. Decisions concerning acceptance of papers will be announced by 15 April 2007. Authors are encouraged to indicate in advance if they are planning to send in a paper.
- All papers must be submitted electronically in pdf format. (see below for web/mail address). It would be helpful if the original document in e.g. Word or Latex were also sent.
- The accepted papers will appear on the AFIR website in a downloadable version one month before the conference. The organizers will produce a cd-rom disk containing all accepted papers, to be distributed to all attendants.

LAYOUT OF PAPER

- Papers shall be written in English or in French.
- Papers should be between 5 and 30 pages in length.
- The first page of the paper should only contain title, name(s), affiliation, and abstract (see below for details). The main text should start at page two.
- The following shows the preferred format of the first page.
 - Title of paper
 - Given name + Family name
 - In the case of several authors, please indicate presenting and corresponding author.
 - Affiliation
 - Address
 - E-mail address
 - Abstract
 - Keywords

- If possible, papers should include a “running heading” on each page, that is, the title (or a shortened version of it), at the top of each page.
- If possible, pages within the paper should be numbered, starting at 1.
