Few subjects arouse quite the same degree of passionate and partisan argument as the presence of aliens on State territory. Their entry, establishment, and expulsion commonly suppose arbitrary and illimitable powers, but this book shows the limit to State discretion. Controlling rules are revealed by an analysis of treaties, State practice, and domestic laws. Nationality and alienage are also examined, while powers over aliens in general are related to developing standards, including principles of human rights and non-discrimination. £14
