This is the last issue of this journal to be published jointly by the African Studies Association of the UK (ASAUK) and the Standing Conference on Library Materials on Africa (SCOLMA), since the ASAUK has decided to withdraw its support from the journal.

African Research and Documentation will however continue to be published by SCOLMA with no change in frequency or subcription rate. The content of the journal will follow the pattern established over the past ten years articles on African bibliography, libraries and archives; book reviews and notes; and news of African studies and research in progress in Britain and elsewhere. The format of the journal will however be changed from A4 to A5 and in future will be typeset, which together should make it easier to handle and read.
