The division of Christendom into the Greek East and the Latin West has its origin far back in history but its consequences still affect Western civilization. This study seeks to indicate both the fundamental character and some of the results of this division. The author contrasts the metaphysical bases of Greek Christian thought with those of the Latin West, and shows how the deep divergence of thought has affected the history of ideas and hence the whole course of European history.
