LIFE AND LETTERS OF DR. EDWARD HINCKS,

1792—1866.

SOME account of the life of this eminent pioneer in oriental studies has recently been prepared by his grandson, together with a selection of his voluminous correspondence. The latter includes letters from many English and foreign scholars, among whom are Layard, Gardner Wilkinson, Fox Talbot, Edwin Norris, G. C. Renouard, Max Müller, Leemans, Lepsius, Grotefend, Brugsch, Lassen, Oppert, Renan, de Rougé, Ménant, Chabas. The correspondence, and the diary which Dr. Hincks kept for the last eighteen years of his life, show the difficulties and disappointments which he encountered in his work, and throw much light upon his rivalry with Rawlinson.

The book is of considerable size, and the cost of printing and producing it is estimated at about £165 for 250 copies. This can only be met by obtaining private subscribers. RULES RELATING TO MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

3. (a) Members shall be divided into three classes :—

(1) Resident Members ; those who usually reside or have a place of business within the London Postal Area.

(2) Non-resident Members ; those who usually reside outside, and have not a place of business within, the above-stated Area.

(3) Honorary Members and Foreign Extraordinary Members admitted as hereinafter provided.

(b) Members in the first two classes are hereinafter designated Ordinary Members.

4. Any person desirous of becoming an Ordinary Member must be nominated by one Member and seconded by another, of whom one must act on a personal knowledge that the candidate is likely to be a suitable and useful Member ; and the nominating Member shall address the Secretary in writing and give the candidate's name, address, titles, and occupation, or status, and shall state to which of the aforesaid classes the candidate desires to be admitted.

19. An Ordinary Member may compound for all future annual subscriptions by paying in lieu thereof one sum calculated according to the Member's age and category as follows :—

Between 40 and 60 years of age : Nine times the annual subscription as laid down in Rule 17.

Over 60 years of age : Seven times the annual subscription as laid down in Rule 17.

23. The first payment of subscription is due on election, but if a Member be elected in November or December of any year, the first annual subscription paid by him shall cover the year beginning on the 1st January next after his election.

24. Annual subscriptions shall be due on the first day of January of each year.
