*Popular Culture*

In 1975-76 the Shelby Cullom Davis Center for Historical Studies will continue its Research Seminar on Popular Culture. The Seminar will examine all aspects of popular culture, such as working class culture: the popular press; the ideological background to popular movements of protest and rebellion; popular organizations such as youth groups and secret societies; popular activities such as festivals and games; the means of propaganda and social control used by those in authority to influence and mold public opinion; and the relation between popular and high culture. The Seminar plans to gather together experts in different periods and countries, and hopes to attract scholars from other disciplines than history.

The Center will offer a limited number of Research Fellowships for one or two semesters, running from September to January and February to June, designed for highly recommended younger scholars, as well as for senior scholars with established reputations. Candidates who have not both finished their dissertations and had at least a year of full-time teaching experience are not eligible. Fellows are expected to live in Princeton, in order to take an active part in the intellectual interchange with other members of the Seminar. Funds are limited, and candidates are, therefore, urged to apply to other grant-giving institutions as well as the Center.

The deadline for Fellowship applications and for letters of recommendation for the academic year 1975-76 is December 1, 1974. Scholars who are not applicants for Fellowships but would like to visit Princeton to offer a paper to the Seminar are asked to write to the Director.

**Land Reform and Politics  
A Comparative Analysis  
Hung-chao Tai**

Tai analyzes the political processes and effects of land reform in the Philippines, Taiwan, Pakistan, Iran, the United Arab Republic, Colombia and Mexico. He advances three hypotheses: the need for legitimacy prompts the elite to initiate reform; the relationship between elite and landed classes determines the program adopted; and the extent of implementation varies with the degree of political commitment.

## NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Contributions may be descriptive, analytical or theoretical. Any article not in itself comparative may be accepted if it lends itself to comment that will place it in comparative perspective. Correspondence with the editors prior to the submission of articles will help to enable them to obtain such comment or a companion study. Emphasis in comparative studies may be either on similarities or, if these are significant enough and call for some recasting of generalisations, on differences. All contributions and editorial correspondence should be sent to the Editors, *Comparative Studies in Society and History*, Department of History, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48104.

Two copies of each contribution, preferably accompanied by a stamped, addressed envelope, should be submitted. Both text and footnotes should be clearly typed with double spacing and wide margins; footnotes should appear on separate pages at the end of the article. Illustrations may be included by arrangement with the editors.

Contributors will receive 50 offprints bound in the journal covers. Any additional offprints must be ordered on receipt of the first proof.
