EDINBURGH JOURNAL OF BOTANY: INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS (November 2014)

Edinburgh Journal of Botany is an international journal of plant systematics. Contributions relating to plant systematics and allied subjects, including biodiversity, conservation science and phytogeography, will be considered. Papers reporting the results of research that link traditional and modern techniques are especially welcomed. Manuscripts should be sent in electronic form to ejb@rbge.org.uk. All manuscripts will be subject to multiple peer review before publication. Submitted manuscripts should not have been accepted for publication or be under consideration elsewhere. The language of the journal is UK English. Authors whose mother tongue is not English should have their papers checked by a fluent or proficient English speaker before submission.

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The title page should include the title, the name(s) and address(es) of the author(s), the abstract, a short running title and a few important keywords. Titles do not normally include authors of scientific names. Correspondence will be addressed to the first author unless otherwise indicated. The abstract should be concise and informative, indicating what the paper contains without summarising it.

Author abbreviations should precisely follow: *The International Plant Names Index*, http://www.ipni.org/index.html; *Index Fungorum, Authors of Fungal Names*, http://www.indexfungorum.org/authorsof fungalnames.htm.

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References in the text should be cited by author and publication date: (Smith, 2014) or 'as stated by Smith (2014)'. Multiple references should be arranged chronologically. For three or more authors use *et al*. In the reference list, references should be in alphabetical order and should appear in the following style:
