THE ROBERT BÁRÁNY JUBILEE FUND.

During the spring of 1936 an appeal was sent out to well-known oto-laryngologists in all countries inviting them to send in, in connection with Robert Bárány's approaching birthday, firstly a message of greeting to him, and secondly a contribution—£1 sterling was suggested—to go to a Robert Bárány Jubileum Fund, which was to be employed in accordance with Professor Bárány's decision on the basis of proposals made by the undersigned.

Since Professor Bárány died on April 8th, we have decided to hand the some 350 messages of greeting received to Professor Bárány's widow in Upsala. The contributions already received and such as may later be received will be handed over to Upsala University as "Robert Bárány's Jubilee Fund". The interest on this fund will be employed for the striking of a Bárány medal to be awarded every fifth year by the medical faculty, on the proposal of the professors in otology, internal medicine, neurology and ophthalmology, to the author of the best work published during the past five-year period on the "Static Sense" in the widest interpretation of the term. The collection will be continued until the end of 1936. The President extends a cordial invitation to all readers of this *Journal* and would be glad to hear from any who intend to be present, so that he may send them an official invitation.



SEMON LECTURE.


