JSCN International Education Fellowship

The Japanese Society of Child Neurology (JSCN) has established an annual fellowship program for promotion of child neurology in the Asian-Oceanian countries. One or two young child neurologists will be invited every year to attend the JSCN annual meeting and visit selected medical institutions in Japan.

Applicants must be under age 40 on the first day of the JSCN meeting, training and practice in the Asian-Oceanian countries, and must present a paper at the JSCN meeting (June 7-9, 2001), either in Japanese or English. Expenses for stay and trip up to two weeks will be paid by the JSCN. The fellowship will not be awarded to applicants from the same country for two consecutive years. The awardee for the year 2000 was from People's Republic of China.
