SURVEY OF CURRENT RESEARCH ON THE MIDDLE EAST

The Middle East Institute, a private organization in Washington, D.C., is preparing for publication an annual Survey of Current Research on the Middle East. The purpose of this Survey is to provide scholars and educational institutions with information on what research has recently been completed or is now being undertaken in the field.

Definition of Research: (1) accumulation of original data; (2) classification of original data; (3) interpretation of data previously accumulated; (4) reinterpretation of data previously studied; (5) translation, bibliography, vocabulary, etc., with annotation. Geographical Limits: the Arab countries, Israel, Afghanistan, Iran, Turkey, North Africa, the Sudan, Ethiopia, and Eritrea. Disciplinary Limits: emphasis on the social sciences, but including all related aspects of the humanities and natural sciences.

Chronological Limits: none (ancient, medieval, and modern). All those who are currently engaged in research on the Middle East, or have completed such research since October 1, 1954, are urged to submit the following information: name, address, topic of investigation, sponsoring organization (if any), date of completion or estimated date if still in progress, and pertinent comments on the nature of the research, sources being used, and method of approach.

The great eighteenth-century Emperor Ch'ien Lung patronised a group of talented Jesuit missionaries, among whom was Brother Castiglione, the painter of many renowned pictures both in the oriental and occidental style. The above illustration of the Emperor's favourie, Hsiang Fei or "The Favourite Concubine" as Minerva, now at the Imperial Palace Museum, Peking, is attributed to him. Simon Harcourt-Smith's graphic account of Ch'ien Lung's lengthy and successful reign, published in the March issue of HSTORY TODAY, as well as Burnard Selby's historical background to the Formosan crisis, are examples of the kind of studies on Asian subjects that appear regularly in HISTORY TODAY.
