Thus new light has been thrown upon many interesting geographical questions suggested by the narratives of mediæval travellers, or hitherto based only upon more modern but vague and dubious Chinese accounts.**To bring the new edition of those former researches up to the present advanced state of knowledge on the subject, the author has studied a vast amount of literature, written for the greater part in Russian, which has come to light during the last fifteen years, on Central Asia, and was obliged to read through a great number of works and papers, some of them published in Russian Turkestan, and, therefore, difficult to obtain.*
