Dear Sir,

May I call the attention of mathematicians in Canada to the sad fate of the young Algerian mathematician Maurice Audin.

Audin was working on his doctor's thesis in Algiers, under the direction of Laurent Schwartz, in June, 1957. In December, 1957 the University of Paris conducted an extraordinary examination to receive Audin's thesis "in absentia".

Mathematicians in France have founded a "Prix Audin" to be awarded annually to an outstanding young mathematician and it has already been awarded to: Lions (1959), Kahane (1960), Neron (1961).

Another "Prix Audin" has been founded by mathematicians in Italy and it is awarded by the University of Rome.
