Please leave any formatting to a minimum; your hard copy will be marked up by the editors to conform with house style. Illustrations should be submitted on CD in JPEG or TIFF format at a minimum of 300 dpi, or as clear prints of photographs or strong outline drawings in ink. Laser-quality print-outs of complicated computer-generated tables or graphics would be appreciated submitted as pdf and Word.
