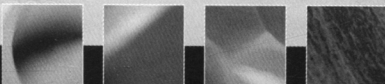

One should be a complete text, while in the second all document information identifying the author should be removed from files to allow them to be sent anonymously to referees. When uploading files authors will then be able to define the non-anonymous version as "File not for review".

**Note to authors.** Please make sure your contact address information is clearly visible on the outside of all packages you are sending to Editors.
