## **Aims and scope**

*Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies (BMGS)* is an internationally recognized, peer-reviewed journal and one of the leading publications in its field. Published twice a year in spring and autumn, its remit is to facilitate the publication of high-quality research and discussion in all aspects of Byzantine and Modern Greek scholarship, whether historical, literary, art-historical, archaeological or social-anthropological. The journal welcomes research, criticism, contributions on theory and method in the form of articles, critical studies and short notes.

**Subscription rates** *Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies* (ISSN 0307-0131) is published twice a year in April and October. Two parts form a volume. The subscription price (excluding VAT) of volume 40 (2016), which includes print and online access, is £230 (US\$401 in the USA, Canada and Mexico) for institutions.
