EDITORIAL POLICY AND PRACTICES

Theatre Survey is chartered by the American Society for Theatre Research as a theatre history journal. Its theatrical and historical orientations are both broadly conceived. Performance-centered studies are welcome from all points across all historical, cultural, and methodological spectra, as are historiographic studies. Dramatic literature studies not substantively related to actual performance normally would be outside the journal's purview.

Manuscripts submitted should be between fifteen and forty pages in length; prepared according to the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 14th ed.; and double-spaced with endnotes. Illustrations are welcome. Please submit three copies to facilitate juried review. The juried review normally takes four to six months. Articles accepted must be submitted both in hard copy and on diskette (IBM-based Microsoft Word 6.0 or compatible). A self-addressed, stamped envelope is required for the return of manuscripts.
