## ERRATA

In Volume 20, Number 1 (March 1989), p. 55, in the second paragraph of "Lao Historiography and Historians: Case Study of the War Between Bangkok and the Lao in 1827", a line has inadvertently been dropped in a quotation from Arthur J.
