APPROVAL OF MENTAL HANDICAP HOSPITALS AND UNITS FOR M.R.C.PSYCH. TRAINING

Under the present rules it is permissible to spend a maximum period of 18 months in a Mental Handicap setting and to have this accepted as valid experience towards the three years' clinical experience necessary before taking the M.R.C.Psych. Examination.

A number of hospitals have been approved as part of a rotational training programme involving other branches of psychiatry. Other Mental Handicap institutions have been approved separately, though they have not as yet been visited by College Approval Panels (see list below).

The Court of Electors has decided to extend the Approval visiting programme to include Mental Handicap hospitals and units. The hospitals listed will be visited during the course of the next three years, having been given due notice. Other hospitals and centres which wish to seek approval for purposes of M.R.C.Psych. training should apply to the Approval Secretary for further information.
