Professor Olafson, in his systematic study of the ethical implications of contemporary existentialism, has attempted to reconcile the Anglo-American and Continental-European positions in the field of ethics and value theory. After analyzing the concept of moral autonomy as represented by the philosophies of Heidegger, Sartre, and Merleau-Ponty, he contends that these writers, as a distinctive group, have worked out a powerful ethical theory as apart from a set of ethical attitudes. The development of 20th century ethical theories on the Continent and in the English-speaking world are reviewed in the light of the broad parallelism that exists between them.

JOHN LOCKE: EPISTOLA DE TOLERANTIA

A Letter on Toleration, edited by RAYMOND KLIBANSKY, translated by J.W. GOUGH. Locke wrote his Epistola de Tolerantia as an exile in Holland, and it was published there anonymously in 1689. The English translation, made in 1689 without Locke's supervision, has been reprinted many times, but the Latin text (here edited by Raymond Klibansky) did not appear between 1768 and 1961. This critical edition is a new and more accurate English translation by J. W. Gough. The Preface places the Epistola in its Dutch setting; the Introduction outlines the antecedents of Locke's theory and discusses his argument. \$6.75
