## CORRECTION

The Editor has received the following communication from Robert Higgs:

"In my article, 'Race, Tenure, and Resource Allocation in Southern Agriculture, 1910,' which appeared in the March 1973 issue of THE JOURNAL OF ECONOMIC HISTORY, a rather massive error by the printer has the effect of reversing the meaning of part of my text and omitting another part. As printed, the first complete sentence on page 154 reads:

As the rental difference, D = E(Rs) - Rf, increases, landlords are willing to supply fewer share contracts, *ceteris paribus*.

The text should have been printed as follows:

As the rental difference, D = E(Rs) - Rf, increases, landlords are willing to supply more share contracts relative to fixed-rent contracts; conversely, as D increases, tenants are willing to accept relatively fewer share contracts, *ceteris paribus*.

This is consistent with the argument that precedes it and with the formal specification that follows it, whereas the statement printed in the article is manifestly inconsistent."
