Père H.M. Féret, O.P. appears once again in print with a short study of the relations between St. Peter and St. Paul at Antioche and Jerusalem. He analyses with characteristic frankness and detail the texts of the Acts and the Epistle to the Galatians in which the apparent conflict between the two great apostles is recounted. He then sets these texts in their historic context, showing the different problems the two saints were faced with. The working out and the solution of this difference between the two great leaders makes fascinating and fruitful reading.
