GERMAN PROTESTANTS FACE THE SOCIAL QUESTION, by *William O. Shanahan*. By bringing about a massive reorganization of the traditional agrarian world the Industrial Revolution so altered man's work, his home and his habits of thought as to place Christianity in jeopardy. The German Protestants became entangled with the national political history in attempting to deal with the social question. How their attempts entered into German history after 1815 provides the narrative of this book. And throughout, the historian's interest in depicting the ties between Christianity and western culture has not been lost to sight. In this dimension the story of the German Protestant response to the Industrial Revolution illumines the fate of western man. \$6.75

PAN-SLAVISM: ITS HISTORY AND IDEOLOGY, by *Hans Kohn*. A scholar brought up in Prague, the center of the Pan-Slavist movement of the 19th century, writes on a question so necessary to the understanding of the complex problems which the emergence of the Slav nations, above all Russia, to full political and cultural participation in the life of the 19th and 20th centuries created for them, for other peoples, and for Western civilization. \$6.25
