SYMPOSIUM ON ACOUSTIC NEUROMAS DIAGNOSIS AND SURGICAL APPROACHES

15-19 JANUARY 1968

The Los Angeles Foundation of Otology and the University of Southern California School of Medicine in co-operation with St. Vincent's Hospital announce a one-week Symposium on Acoustic Neuromas.

The theme of the symposium will be the controversial aspects of diagnosis and treatment of these tumours.

The faculty will consist of outstanding authorities in the fields of neurosurgery, otology and radiology. The symposium will include closed-circuit television demonstrations of surgical techniques now being used. Lectures and panels of authorities representing different points of view will discuss the new methods of diagnosis and current surgical treatment of these most difficult problems.

The tuition fee of \$300 will include noon luncheons and is payable to the Los Angeles Foundation of Otology (in U.S. currency) at the time of application. The tuition fee for residents in neurosurgery, otolaryngology, and radiology is \$100. Application from residents must be accompanied with a letter of recommendation from their Chief of Service.
