This book examines the social forces generated within the Sulu Sultanate by the China trade, a trade which dominated so much of the economic life of Southeast Asia—namely, the advent of organized, long-distance slave raiding and the incorporation of foreign peoples on a large scale into Taosug society. The author reconstructs the social, economic, and political relationships of various groups in a multi-ethnic zone of which Sulu was the centre. The study demonstrates that it was the resilient structure of a segmentary state patterned on a mosaic principle of ethnic segmentation and economic interdependence, rather than the "classic" stratified Indonesian harbour principality, that was best able to withstand the test of the "forward movement" of the European powers in the nineteenth century.
