Black Hands of Beijing

Lives of Defiance in China's Democracy Movement By George Black and Robin Munro

This vivid chronicle of the lives of three Chinese compatriots reveals the defiant spirit that drives the struggle for democracy in China. No other book has so expertly rendered the inner workings of the Chinese democracy movement from its first inspiring tremors in 1976 to the present.

"Black", in the lexicon of the Chinese Communist Party, means the antithesis of "red". The term originated in Mao Zedong's radical land reform

program of the early 1950s, which targeted the Black Five Elements: landlords, rich peasants, reactionaries, rightists and the catch-all category of "bad elements". According to the official line, the "Black Elements" attended "black meetings" in which they concocted "black materials", and if they rose high enough to manipulate others, they became "black hands".

Black and Munro have travelled extensively in China and interviewed hundreds of participants, from leading intellectuals to rank-and-file workers, uncovering crucial elements of the story of the movement never revealed before. The authors previously collaborated on a special issue of *The Nation* to commemorate the first anniversary of the crushing of the Tiananmen Square democracy movement, which was nominated for the 1990 National Magazine Award.
