Early this century, Arthur Ruffell Barlow, a young layman of the Church of Scotland Mission in Kenya, started to collect information about the Kikuyu and their language, but had not finished the *English-Kikuyu Dictionary* when he died in 1965. The remainder was completed, with the help of Kikuyu scholars, and the whole work edited by Mr. T. G. Benson. This painstaking experiment in the rendering of English concepts into a rich African language will provide a treasury of the Kikuyu language for future scholars. £6.50
