## **FPS Annual General Meeting**

Charles de Haes, Director General of World Wildlife Fund International, was the speaker at the FPS Annual General Meeting on July 5th. The President, Lord Zuckerman, was in the chair. Dr Harold J. Coolidge, distinguished US scientist and a former President of IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature), was elected a Vice-President of the Society. Dr Coolidge has also been Chairman of both the Survival Service Commission and of the International Committee on National Parks, and was for many years Secretary of the Pacific Science Association.

Three members of Council retired and were warmly thanked by the Chairman for their services: Jeffery Boswall, Dr Michael Brambell and Philip Wayre. Three new Council members were elected in their place: J.M. Knowles, Dr R.D. Martin and Lord

Medway. The Annual Report and Accounts were approved.

Mr de Haes outline WWF's policy for the future and stressed the need for conservation organisations to work together. He urged all British charities to lobby for charitable donations to be made tax-deductible, as they are in the USA.

The Vice-Chairman, Lord Craigton, proposed a warm vote of thanks to the FPS staff for devoted service, and one to the Zoological Society of London for continuing to provide office accommodation, services, and much other assistance during the year. After a wine and cheese supper a film, *The Business of Extinction*, was shown, and members were able to participate in a Zoo open evening.
