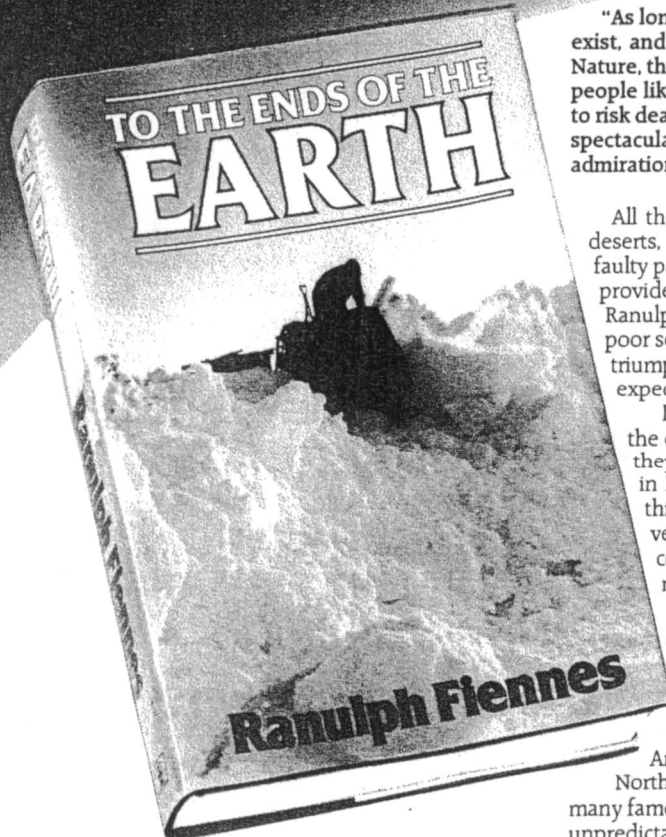

All the rapids, whirlpools, avalanches, deserts, swamps, terrorist bullets and faulty parachutes that have hitherto provided the rich ingredients of Sir Ranulph Fiennes' eventful career, take a poor second place to the horrors and triumphs of his remarkable Transglobe expedition.

In 1972 his wife, Ginnie, conceived the circumpolar idea. For seven years they strove to raise support for it and in 1979 set off from Greenwich in a thirty-year-old ice-strengthened vessel, Benjamin Bowring, with a colourful crew of volunteers from many countries and backgrounds.

The 100,000-mile route took them across the Sahara via Tombouctou, through the swamps and jungles of Mali and the Ivory Coast, over huge unexplored crevasse fields in Antarctica, through the inhospitable North West Passage, graveyard of so many famous ventures, and into the unpredictable hazards of the Arctic Ocean.

Ranking alongside the journeys of Amundsen, Scott and Peary, the Transglobe endeavour, a chance dream in 1972, became ten years later a truly historic voyage.

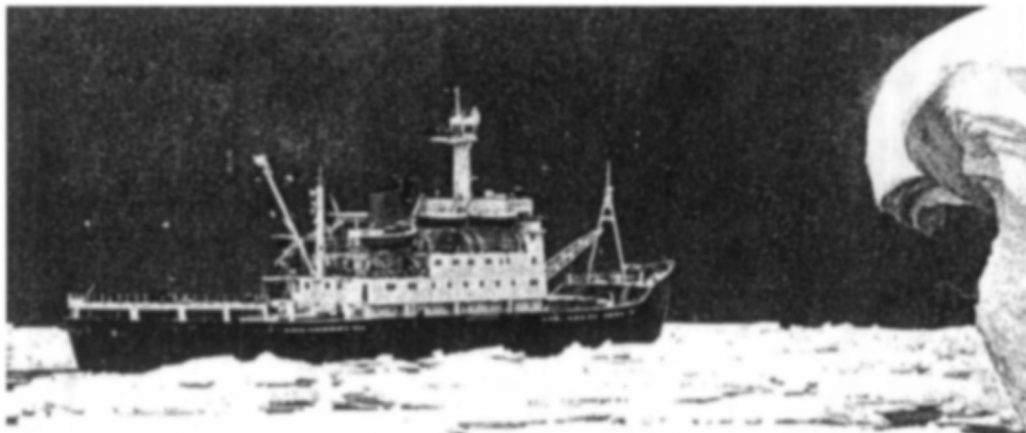
