RIMO-PRIZE 1986-1987

To promote the study of Islamic Law and the Law of the Middle East, the association for the study of ISLAM and the MIDDLE EAST (RIMO) situated in Groningen (The Netherlands) has introduced the RIMO-prize.

Every two years this prize will be awarded for a dissertation, an article or any other form of writing on the Law of the Islam and the Middle East. The 1986-1987 prize will amount to Dfl. 1500,00.

The prize is intended as an award for original research and is generally extended to a single person, but may be divided between two or more individuals.

Furthermore the winner will be invited to hold a lecture on his submitted subject at the annual RIMO-symposium.

Attention will be drawn to the fact that students at a Law Faculty or an Arts Faculty may compete for the RIMO-prize on the basis of their university theses. The RIMO-prize will preferably be awarded to those who at the time of writing the thesis had not yet attained the age of 35. In their judgment, the members of the jury being: Prof. dr.mr. J. Brugman, professor of Arabic at the University of Leyden and president of RIMO, Mr. drs. F.A. van Bakelen, lecturer of commercial law at the University of Groningen and secretary and treasurer of RIMO, Mr. G.R. de Groot, principal lecturer of civil law and comparative law at the University of Limburg and member of the RIMO board, will take into consideration the originality, composition, linguisitic usage and social relevance.
