

## NOTES FOR THE CONTRIBUTORS

The average length of the manuscript should range from:

5000 to 8000 words for Leading Articles, 6000 to 10,000 words for Student Contributions, 3000 to 4000 words for Current Legal Developments.

The manuscript should be written in English and be submitted in duplicate with both the text and footnotes typed and double spaced on A4 paper (legal format). Preferably manuscripts should also be submitted on word processing diskettes compatible with the IBM PC system, if possible using WordPerfect software. Footnotes should be placed in seperate files.

Authors are asked to submit an abstract of their contribution not exceeding 100 words.

Authors should indicate their current affiliations and what brief personal details they would like to appear under their names.

The editors will only consider original, unpublished work which is not being submitted for publication elsewhere.

All manuscripts submitted to the Journal will be subjected to review by the editors before being accepted for publication.

All manuscripts submitted become the property of the Journal.

Authors will not receive a fee, but will be presented with two copies of the Journal in which their contribution is published, and 10 offprints of their article.
