### CONTRIBUTORS

MORTON N. COHEN, Professor of English at the City College and the CUNY Graduate Center, is editor of *The Letters of Lewis Carroll*. He is now writing a life of the author of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* and preparing an edition of the Dodgson–Macmillan correspondence.

JUNE STEFFENSEN HAGEN, author of *Tennyson and His Publishers* (1979), is an assistant professor of English at The King's College, Briarcliff Manor, N.Y. Her articles on Tennyson, Arnold, and Sterne have appeared in *Victorian Poetry*, *Costerus*, the *Arnoldian*, the *English Quarterly*, and other journals.

PHILIP KELLEY and RONALD HUDSON are working on an edition of the collected correspondence of the Brownings. They are co-compilers of *The Brownings' Correspondence: A Checklist* (1978) and co-editors of *Diary by E.B.B.: The Unpublished Diary of Elizabeth Barrett Barrett* (1969).

ADRIENNE MUNICH, Lecturer in English at Yale University, has recently edited, with Harold Bloom, Robert Browning: A Collection of Critical Essays. She has published articles on emblems and typology in Robert Browning's poems and is now working on a study of Browning's methods of figural representation.

ROBERT SECOR, Director of Graduate Studies in the English Department of Pennsylvania State University, is the author of *The Rhetoric of Shifting Perspectives: Conrad's Victory* (1971) and the general editor of *Pennsylvania 1776* (1975). He is working on a critical biography of Violet Hunt.

JOANNE SHATTOCK is the Bibliographer at the Victorian Studies Centre, University of Leicester. She has published articles on various nineteenth-century subjects, and is now editing, with Michael Wolff, a book on the Victorian periodical press and is working on an edition of Mrs. Oliphant and a study of the day-to-day running of a Victorian quarterly.

JOHN SUTHERLAND has taught at the University of Edinburgh and at University College London, where he is currently a Reader in English. He has published *Thackeray at Work* (1974) and *Victorian Novelists and Publishers* (1976). He is currently working on aspects of nineteenth- and twentieth-century British publishing.
