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The History of Education Society reserves the right not to make awards in years when the Prize Committee judges all entries to be of insufficient quality.



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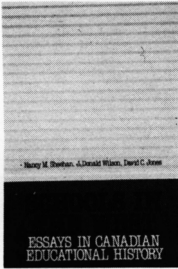


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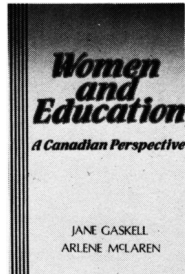
