Society, of which he was a past-Chairman, and he was also concerned in the activities of the Welsh Division of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, of which he was a Fellow.

Dr Rosenberg will always be remembered by his expatients and medical and nursing colleagues as a friendly, courteous, loyal and warm-hearted man who was always keenly interested in his specialty and who gave freely of his advice and support. He is survived by his wife to whom we extend our deepest sympathy.

## GIDEON MORDECAI WODDIS, retired, formerly Physician Superintendent, The Coppice Hospital, Nottingham.

Keith Woddis was educated at Christ College, Finchley and obtained a Jefferson Exhibition to Bart's Hospital. Very soon after qualification he went to the Coppice Hospital, Nottingham, where in 1943 he became the Medical Superintendent, although for several years previously he had run the hospital in all but name because of the prolonged illness of the then Superintendent.

Any account of Keith Woddis's work must centre on the Coppice Hospital. Here, almost single-handed, he had developed a Social Treatment Unit which embraced patients and staff in a very unusual, warm, caring community. It was here, too, that Keith, using his extensive knowledge of group dynamics and his instinctive psychotherapeutic skill, produced a haven for numerous doctors, nurses and administrators and their spouses who sought treatment there, together with innumerable other patients.

The ability to manage a small hospital humanely and psychotherapeutically is a skill fast dying out in the National Health Service, but Keith Woddis both exercised that skill and taught it to anyone who would listen.

He used some of his skills to aid delinquent patients. He wrote wisely about depression and crime and his opinion was respected in medico-legal spheres in the Midlands. After his retirement he served on the Mental Health Review Tribunals

in the Trent Region.

Any account of his work looks little enough—a few papers, the nurturing of a hospital now used for other purposes—but there was no one whose life he touched who was not enlivened and enriched by his warmth, humanity and wisdom. All who knew him well have experienced some part of the loss that his wife, son and daughter now feel.
