FACTS ABOUT "EXPERIMENTS ON BINAURAL HEARING IN NOISE"

Copies of "Experiments on Binaural Hearing in Noise" by Harald Feldmann, M.D., are now available in an English translation from the Beltone Institute for Hearing Research.

The 42 page work by Dr. Feldmann, of the Department of Otolaryngology, University of Heidelberg, originally was published in German in the Archiv., Ohren-usw. Heilk of the Springer Verlag in 1963.

In a long series of experiments, described in this article, Dr. Feldmann found that signal detection is improved if the listener is able to localize the signal and the competing noise in two different directions. The best detection is obtained when the signal comes from one side and the noise from the front.

The Feldmann *Translation* is the 18th in a series. The 17th was "Accelerated Speech Audiometry, An Examination of Test Results", by J. B. de Quiros, translated from the Spanish and published in June, 1964. The new *Translation* and earlier works may be obtained by writing to the Beltone Institute for Hearing Research, 4201 W.
