THE CONTRIBUTORS

ADAM B. ULAM is Associate Professor of Government and Research Associate at the Russian Research Center, Harvard University. The author of *Titoism and the Cominform* (1952), he contributed to *Continuity and Change in Russian and Soviet Thought* (1955) and is co-author and co-editor, with S. H. Beer, of *The Patterns of Government* (1958).

BERNARD BRODIE, a Senior Staff Member of The RAND Corporation, is the author of A Guide to Naval Strategy (4th ed., 1958) and co-author of The Absolute Weapon: Atomic Power and World Order (1946).

RICHARD MOORSTEEN is a member of the research staff of The RAND Corporation.

LOUIS MORTON is Chief of Military History, Department of the Army.
