She has been a fellow of the Centre for Development Research, Copenhagen, since 1984, and published with them (in 1988 and in 1991) studies on Kipsigis women based on the fieldwork which she did there together with Anne Sørensen.

DEIDRE CRUMBLEY teaches in the Departments of Anthropology and Religion at the University of Florida at Gainesville. She was on the faculty of the University of Ibadan for four years, and now focuses her research on the various formations of Christianity in Africa and its New World diaspora.
